LOCATIONS

In 2007, there were **24,221** eating-and-drinking places in Pennsylvania.

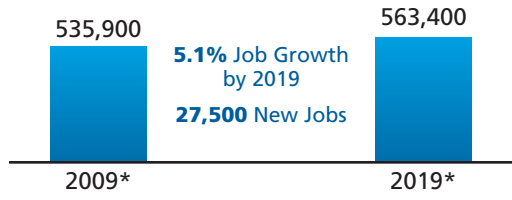
STATE ECONOMY

Every \$1 spent in Pennsylvania's restaurants generates an additional **\$1.25 in sales** for Pennsylvania's economy.

Each additional \$1 million spent in Pennsylvania's eating-and-drinking places generates an additional **29.8 jobs** in Pennsylvania.

Restaurant jobs represent **9 percent** of total employment in Pennsylvania.

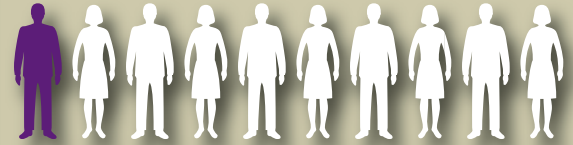
SALES

Almost **1 in 10** working Americans are restaurant employees

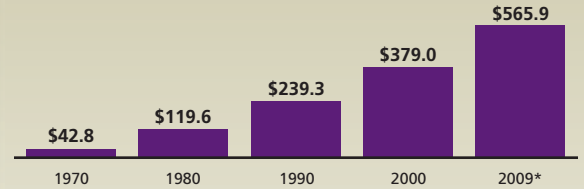


Restaurants' share of the food dollar is rising
