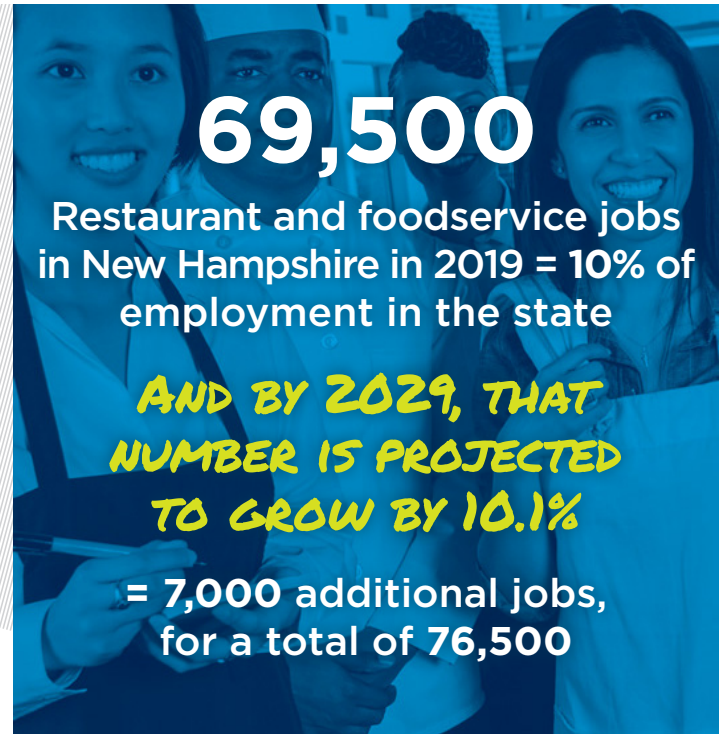

contributes \$1.76 to the state economy.


Every dollar spent in the limited-service segment
